Metropolitan Topeka Airport Authority January 18, 2022

Chairman, Mike Munson, brought the regular monthly meeting of the MTAA Board of Directors to order at 3:00 PM with the following Board members present: Lisa Stubbs, Brian Armstrong and Erica Garcia-Babb. Tom Wright attended via ZOOM. Also in attendance were:

Item 1. Notice.

Chairman Munson inquired if everyone who requested notification had been notified of this meeting. Ms. Trobough replied that notifications were sent.

Item 2. Approve Minutes of the MTAA's Regularly Scheduled Board Meeting of December 21, 2021 and the Special Teleconference Board Meeting of December 29, 2021.

Chairman Munson asked the Board to review the Minutes of the Regularly Scheduled Board Meeting of December 21, 2021 and the Special Teleconference Board Meeting of December 29, 2021 and inquired if there were any additions, corrections or comments to the Minutes.

Ms. Stubbs moved to approve the Minutes of the Regularly Scheduled Board Meeting of December 21, 2021. Ms. Garcia-Babb seconded the motion. Mr. Armstrong stated that he would be abstaining from the vote because of the miscommunication he was not on the call for the meeting. Motion carried with Mr. Armstrong abstaining.

Ms. Garcia-Babb moved to approve the Minutes of the Special Teleconference Board Meeting of December 29, 2021. Mr. Wright seconded the motion. Ms. Stubbs signified her abstention due to her absence. Motion carried with Ms. Stubbs abstaining.

Item 3. Public Comment

Chairman Munson inquired if there was anyone registered to speak during Public Comment. Mr. Johnson replied that there was not.

Item 4. Adopt the Agenda.

Chairman Munson inquired if there were any changes to the Agenda as presented.

Ms. Garcia-Babb made a motion to adopt the Agenda as presented. Ms. Stubbs seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Before proceeding with the agenda, Chairman Munson advised the Board on recent developments. The overall message conveyed by Chairman Munson is as follows:

The MTAA Board of Directors are in the unique position and have the pleasure of overseeing the operations of two very successful, long-standing airports that serve the interests of many individuals and businesses in this region and our Capital City. It is up to us as a board, in conjunction with the management of the MTAA, to ensure that we maximize the potential of our airport facilities and property.

On Tuesday, January 11, Eric Johnson, President of the MTAA, had the opportunity to present an update on MTAA operations to the City Council. Also in attendance at that meeting were Mr. Munson and Mr. Armstrong. The meeting was a positive reinforcement of how excited our local elected officials and others are to work together with the MTAA to put our airports on a path toward expanded opportunities and future success at both Billard and Topeka Regional.

Mr. Munson, Mr. Johnson and Mr. Resner have planned a trip to Salina Regional Airport on Friday, January 21, to meet with Tim Rogers, Director of Airport and the Salina Airport Authority board's legal counsel, Greg Bengston, to discuss what has worked for them and what hasn't.

Mr. Hyjek's presentation, "Growing the Aerospace & Defense Industry in Topeka" is on-point with these issues.

Item 5. Aerospace / Aviation Industry Growth Opportunities Presentation.

A presentation by Steven Hyjek, Senior Policy Advisor with Baker Donelson, provided an overview of the work completed in the last year, along with recommendations on how a pro-economic development strategy (which includes a shared-risk strategy) would yield the aviation / aerospace industry economic development objectives with Topeka Regional Airport (FOE) as a centerpiece of that effort.

The full Powerpoint presentation is attached and made a part of the official minutes.

tem 6. Consider Purchase of One (1) New Police Vehicle.

Mr. Johnson reported that the approved 2022 budget includes \$50,000 for the purchase of a new police patrol vehicle. Just as it was in 2021, delivery of any type of vehicle is substantially delayed due to supply chain disruptions. Staff looked into availability and found Shawnee Mission Ford has a 2022 Ford Explorer Police package due for delivery to the dealer in late February or early March. They have provided a quote of \$35,694.00 for this vehicle. Ellis Boys CDJR also provided a quote of \$43,215.00 for a Dodge Durango however, the estimated cost is several thousand dollars more and the order has not begun production. At this time, an anticipated delivery date is not available.

Mr. Johnson requested the MTAA Board of Directors waive the requirement of soliciting sealed bids for this purchase. Going out to bid for a vehicle at this time may result in not taking delivery for several months or quite possibly not purchasing a much-needed vehicle this year.

Mr. Resner advised that a waiver is not necessary. According to the policy adopted by the Board, Section II, 5. E. states "for purchases where the MTAA Board of Directors determines that only one known source exists, that only one single supplier can fulfill the requirements, that a used item which meets the requirements becomes available and is subject to immediate sale, including an auction, or that it is not in the best interest of the MTAA to solicit bids in accordance with paragraphs 1, 2 or 3 of this Section II."

Mr. Johnson made a recommendation that the Board approve the quote offered by Shawnee Mission Ford for the 2022 Ford Explorer for \$35,694.00 and authorize staff to proceed with the purchase of the vehicle.

Mr. Armstrong made a motion to authorize staff to proceed with the purchase of the 2022 Ford Explorer from Shawnee Mission Ford at a cost not to exceed Thirty-five Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-four dollars and no Cents (\$35,694.00). Mr. Wright seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Information Only Items: Item 7. Monthly Reports

7.a. Aviation-Related Issues & Air Service – Mr. Johnson

Mr. Johnson provided the following report:

• The DOT released the 2022 Small Community Air Service Development (SCASD) Grant application RFP last week. Applications are due on March 15. The big thing to note is that there is \$17 million available – which is the most in many years. That means there will be more awards made.

Air service has always been a challenge but the pandemic is making it even more difficult. Airlines have parked dozens of regional jets that serve markets like Topeka. While major airlines are canceling fewer flights now that the holiday rush has passed, many travelers with seats on planes operated by regional carriers are still experiencing significant disruptions. Regional airlines operate 43% of scheduled passenger flights in the United States, according to the Regional Airline Association.

 Staff recently submitted the Airport Capital Improvement Program project list to the FAA. AIP-eligible projects are submitted to the FAA on an annual basis to keep everyone up to date on plans and update anticipated costs for each. The majority of MTAA projects rely heavily on discretionary funds and must compete for the funding.

7.b. Economic Development & Leasing Activity – Mr. Johnson

Mr. Johnson provided the following report:

- There is a prospective tenant for the recently vacated warehouse space. As soon as repairs are made to the space, details will be worked out to see if this building will meet their needs.
- Not really economic development but some repairs will need to be made to the terminal building. The building suffered some wind damage during the recent storm, but because of that damage, it was discovered there is some hidden water damage. The work will be identified and bids will be solicited.
- DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS (as of 12/31/2021)
 - Paul Kirk dba Advance Street Rod Design Account remains delinquent for finance charges and a portion of the September invoice and October, November & December invoices;
 - Tony Lynch Delinquent for finance charges and November invoice & December invoices;

 - <u>Rural Development Corporation</u> Partial payments were received for the March, April, May & June, July and August 2020 invoices. Finance charges on unpaid balances each month. All unpaid charges relate to Bldg. #624;

Mr. Johnson provided the following report on <u>December Leasing Activity:</u>

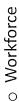

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties entered into a Professional Services Agreement on 21 July 2020;

WHEREAS, MTAA has determined the need for CONSULTANT to perform preliminary site planning and opinions of probable costs for the potential Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) improvements at Topeka Regional Airport, Topeka, Kansas

NOW, THEREFORE, for the consideration hereinafter set forth, the parties do mutually agree as follows:

SCOPE OF CONSULTANT SERVICES - PHASE ONE

I. Project Objective:

A. Background.

This project is for the planning services and the development of opinions of probable cost for potential MRO improvements at Topeka Regional Airport, Topeka, Kansas for the Metropolitan Topeka Airport Authority (MTAA). The purpose of the planning services and development of opinions of probable costs is to provide information to the MTAA and others for use in potential development of MRO facility(ies) at Topeka Regional Airport.

The MTAA has expressed a desire to review two different sites at Topeka Regional Airport for potential MRO development. These two sites are identified as: Abandoned Apron Site and Ammo Road Site. Additionally, the MTAA has expressed a desire to consider a one-hangar and a two-hangar facility in the planning and the development of opinions of probable costs.



B. Physical Project Goals:

- 1. Provide preliminary planning concepts for the development of two different sites, as previously described.
- 2. Provide preliminary concepts for one-hangar and two-hangar scenarios at each of the two sites. In each scenario, room for future growth will be evaluated and discussed.
- 3. Provide for preliminary opinions of probable costs for each of the site scenarios.
- 4. Discussions regarding the advantages and the disadvantages for each site, as well as the opinions of probable costs for each site scenario, shall be presented in a brief report.

C. Funding

1. Funding for the project is to be provided solely by the Metropolitan Topeka Airport Authority with no other funding partners participating in the project. CONSULTANT will not be required to track the funding participation in the project by others except for the Metropolitan Topeka Airport Authority.

D. Division of Engineering Work.

- 1. This task order provides for the planning services and the development of opinions of probable cost for potential MRO improvements at Topeka Regional Airport, Topeka, Kansas.
- 2. No other services are to be provided under this task order.

II. Project Task Descriptions:

A. General:

- 1. CONSULTANT shall provide preliminary planning services for the project that consists of site visits, limited field measurements, analysis, design rationale, design, and developing opinions of probable costs for the purpose of providing information to the MTAA and others for use in project development.
- CONSULTANT <u>shall not</u> assist the MTAA, in the preparation of documentation required to comply with Federal and State Environmental requirements. It is assumed that the project will be eligible for a Categorical Exclusion and that an Environmental Assessment or an Environmental Impact Statement will not be



required. Services for an EA or EIS (or other NEPA clearances/certifications) are not included in this scope of services and are considered additional work.

3. No other permits or certifications are anticipated or included in the scope of services for the project.

B. Planning Services.

The CONSULTANT shall prepare the planning services and the development of opinions of probable cost for potential MRO improvements at Topeka Regional Airport. Planning scope items shall include the following:

- 1. Provide preliminary concepts for the development of two different sites, as previously described.
- 2. Provide preliminary concepts for one-hangar and two-hangar scenarios at each of the two sites. In each scenario, room for future growth will be evaluated and discussed.
- 3. Concept development will be based upon the Boeing 777 aircraft as the design aircraft. Hangar facilities will be designed to house two design aircraft at one time.
- 4. Presentation of concepts shall be on two-dimensional drawings overlaid on aerial photographs to show the layout of the proposed site improvements in relationship with existing physical conditions. Three dimensional renderings can be provided for an additional cost if desired.
- 5. Site work improvements to be considered in the concept developments shall include:
 - i. Grading
 - 1. Line of sight assessment for Abandoned Apron Area.
 - ii. Drainage
 - iii. Retention/Detention facilities (if required)
 - iv. Water Quality Best Management Practices (BMP)
 - v. Determination if NEPA study, etc. is necessary. It is assumed that a Categorical Exclusion (CATEX) will satisfy NEPA requirements.
 - vi. Utilities
 - 1. Gas
 - 2. Water
 - 3. Electricity
 - 4. Sewer
 - 5. Telecommunications
 - vii. Access Roads/Drives
 - viii. Fencing
 - ix. Pavements
 - 1. Hangar Aprons
 - 2. Taxi lane



3. Aircraft Parking

- 6. Opinion of Probable Cost data shall be developed for the following scenarios:
 - x. Abandoned Apron Area One-Hangar Facility
 - xi. Abandoned Apron Area Two-Hangar Facility
 - xii. Ammo Road Area One-Hangar Facility
 - xiii. Ammo Road Area Two-Hangar Facility
- 7. Probable cost data available from historical aviation and highway information shall be used for the development of opinions of probable costs.
- 8. Discussions regarding the advantages and the disadvantages for each site, as well as the opinions of probable costs for each site scenario, shall be presented in a brief report.
- 9. Project designs and quantities are to be developed with the use of publicly available lidar survey data.
- 10. Geotechnical investigations will not be performed as a part of this task order.
- 11. The MTAA understands that the development of quantities and designs will meet lower standards of expectations as compared to an in-depth design project requiring a higher level of resource commitment.
- 12. WSP shall meet with the MTAA on two different occasions:
 - i. Project Initiation Meeting discuss project requirements and goals.
 - ii. Submission of 95% Complete Documents review and discuss developed work with MTAA and to receive comments/modifications to developed work.
- 13. WSP shall meet with the MTAA and others on one occasion:
 - i. State officials to present developed work.

III. Project Schedule:

CONSULTANT shall complete the task order work in accordance with the following schedule based on the MTAA's Notice to Proceed (NTP) to the CONSULTANT:

IV. Project Sustainability Initiatives:

The CONSULTANT shall utilize electronic correspondence and electronic documents when communicating or transferring information between the CONSULTANT, the MTAA, and certain project stakeholders. Information/documentation exchanged shall include, but is not limited to, project related materials such as project memorandum and correspondence, required project submittals, review comments and disposition, and the project quality control program and checks.

The overall purpose of the use of electronic media shall be to minimize the need for the printing of hardcopy materials (unless specifically required by this Agreement), to facilitate timely exchange and reviews of project related materials and provide a comprehensive record of the project design activities.

VI. Project Deliverables:

- A. CONSULTANT shall submit one (1) sets each of at the 95% level of preliminary concept development and opinions of probable costs. Drawings shall be submitted on 11" X 17" reduced drawings.
- B. CONSULTANT shall submit two (2) sets (11X17) each of a final (100% level) of concept development drawings and a brief report of advantages/disadvantages and opinions of probable costs.
- C. CONSULTANT shall pay for all reproduction, printing and distribution cost associated with progress submissions. The MTAA shall arrange for and pay all costs associated with printing of the documents required for submission to other entities.

VII. Progress Meetings & Reports:

CONSULTANT shall submit bi-weekly progress reports, preferably single page summaries. Progress reports will document decisions made and work progress during period, work scheduled for next period, problems and open issues. The overall project schedule will be updated bi-weekly and submitted as part of the progress reports.

VIII. Meetings and Presentations:

- A. CONSULTANT shall meet with the MTAA on two different occasions:
 - 1. Project Initiation Meeting discuss project requirements and goals.
 - 2. Submission of 95% Complete Documents review and discuss developed work with MTAA and to receive comments/modifications to developed work.



- 3. Consultant shall also make presentations of project design information, cost, schedules, etc., to the MTAA Board of Directors (one (1) meetings maximum).
- 4. CONSULTANT shall take notes and distribute draft minutes of all presentations and meetings for review, address comments received, and distribute final minutes for each meeting or presentation within five working days to maintain the effectiveness of the effort and the schedule of the project.

IX. <u>Document Archiving</u>:

- A. The CONSULTANT shall prepare preliminary concept drawings and a brief report presenting advantages/disadvantages and opinions of probable costs for archiving. Items to be archived include, but are not limited to, correspondence and minutes. CONSULTANT shall also review all documents for project closeout for content and elimination of duplicates. Items previously included in submissions are not required to be re-submitted.
- B. Items shall be archived on electronic disk (CD or DVD), containing the original documents in their appropriate format, that is, ".docx", ".xlsx", or ".mpp" and all documents in ".pdf" format. All pages in the ".pdf" format files shall be orientated correctly so that they can be read upon opening. File sizes of the ".pdf" format files should be minimized as much as possible for easier download and viewing. Typical file sizes should not exceed 2 MB per file. Files should be generated from the electronic source files versus scanned images from a hard copy, when possible.

X. Compensation

- A. The MTAA shall compensate CONSULTANT for the performance of the preliminary planning services and development of opinions of probable costs as stated above, the amount indicated in the Task Order No. 6.
- B. In the event a particular task is deleted from the planning services and development of opinion of probable cost phases, the appropriate amount of monies associated for that task in the particular phase shall be deducted from the totals provided above. The appropriate amount of monies will be the subtotals provided for the individual tasks in phases as presented in Exhibit A, Fee Proposal. Adjustments to the contract amounts provided here shall be made as an Exhibit B, Fee Adjustments, to this agreement.
- C. In the event that additional services are required for the project, the hourly rates provided for in Exhibit A, Fee Proposal will be utilized in the negotiation process if the additional services are to be compensated for based upon a cost-plus maximum agreement.



Both parties agree that this Task Order No. 6-2022 MRO Preliminary Site Planning and Opinions of Probable Costs Services at Topeka Regional Airport is entered into in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement and all of the terms, covenants and conditions of the Agreement are incorporated into and made a part of this Task Order.

For the Multi-Purpose First Responder Vehicle

(Board Action Required)



Date: February 9, 2022

We budgeted \$250,000.00 in the 2021 budget for the purchase of a First Responder Vehicle. The Danko Emergency Equipment bid of \$208,500.00 was authorized by the Board during the May 2021 meeting and it is on order. The remaining funds were intended to procure equipment for this truck. Staff obtained a quote for this equipment from Danko as well.

As a reminder, the apparatus will respond to the following types of calls:

- **Medical responses** Primary Function, as medical calls are our most frequent response. This will reduce usage of over-sized vehicles for response.
- Grass responses Will replace Brush 3 that has been mechanically failing.
- HazMat responses Will be equipped with required monitoring and mitigation equipment.
- **Rescue response** Will supplement the Aerial on all rescues, allows apparatus access where the Aerial may be too big, allows quick water deployment. Lighter and 4x4 will allow for off road access. Has attachment points around the apparatus for vehicle/aircraft stabilization.
- **ARFF responses** Lighter and 4x4 will allow access to incidents within safety areas that large ARFF trucks cannot access allowing foam deployment, has onboard Class B foam system operated from within the cab by a single firefighter.

As you can see above, the design of this apparatus will allow for responses to almost every call we respond to, either as primary or supplemental, making it our most commonly used apparatus. In addition to design, it allows for us to place equipment for various responses versus it being geared towards one style of call response. The equipment on the attached quote will be installed on the truck prior to it being placed in service.

It is my recommendation the Board authorize staff to purchase the equipment for the First Responder Vehicle from Danko Emergency Equipment and local vendors at a total cost of Thirty-Eight Thousand One Hundred Forty-three Dollars and Ninety-nine Cents (\$38,143.99). The 2021 allocated funds of \$250,000 have been encumbered for the 2022 purchase of the apparatus and the equipment.

With lessons learned last year, staff started early this year to obtain quotes for airfield paint. You may recall paint was backordered several months in 2021. Each year we are required to ensure paint marking on our runways, taxiways and aprons meet FAA requirements. Given the size of the airfield, this requires a significant amount of paint even with a rotational schedule.

Of the vendors contacted, Spectrum paint is the only vendor that has indicated they can supply the paint in 55-gallon drums. This discounts the price by \$0.25 per gallon, and considering the number of markings we need to address, the drums simplify the process. Lead time for production is at least eight to ten weeks.

I recommend the Board authorize staff to purchase the required paint in preparation for the upcoming season at a cost of Fifteen Thousand Fifty-Three Dollars and Fifty-six Cents. (\$15,053.56).
